METHODOLOGY

This probabilistic survey was conducted March 15 – 17, 2021, with 421 likely 2022 general election voters. It has a margin of error of $\pm 4.77\%$. Known registered voters were interviewed via live phones. This survey was weighted to a likely 2022 general election voter universe.
